ABSTRACT

Indonesia is now entering a national emergency situtation towards sexual violence and abuse against children to which children's sexual violence issues is increasing yearly. Indonesian Children Protection Commission (KPAI) shows data that since 2013 have occurred more than 3.200 cases of violence on Indonesian children, 50% of them is sexual violence of children cases specifically on sexual abuse (children's outrage). In 2011, there was 329 cases, in 2012 happened 746 cases, in 2013 it also happened 590 cases, and 2014 it increased to 1217 cases in which in total of 2882 cases happened. Anal sex against children, outrage and pedophilia, in the year of 2011 had occurred 160 cases, in 2012 happened 173 cases, in 2013 also increased 184 cases, and in 2014 occurred 263 cases and in the year of 2017 increased to 1.726 cases of sexual violence on children. The objective of this research is to define personality representation on children pre-sexual violence and post-sexual violence as well as traumatic effects on children that have experience of sexual violence. The research took place in Bekasi City, West Java, Indonesia. Research methodology used in this research is Qualitative method in which by measuring children's personality with Graphic Scale. The result of graphic shows that children's personality as victim of sexual violence have introvert character with impact. after experiencing KSPA, they also severely traumatic effect, this is supported with information from parents who also claimed that children tended to be depressed and academic achievement was decreased in which the result of intelligence measurement was done on children with KSPA condition. The Conclusion of this research is derived that children with KSPA have introvert personality and experiencing an severely traumatic effect that need psychological therapist treatment.
