Abstract: The study examines the contribution of faith-based leadership to community development within faith institutions. While the impact of faith leaders in shaping social and cultural norms has been noted, less is yet to be known regarding how leadership dynamics of faith leaders enhance or weaken community empowerment and social cohesion. The overarching concern is how faith-based leadership styles facilitate or limit community development initiatives in various socio-economic contexts. The central purpose of this research is to gain an understanding of community members' and leaders' perceptions and experiences of the role of faith-based leadership in social transformation. Adopting a qualitative research design, the data were gathered through in-depth interviews with faith leaders, stakeholders in organizations, and community members, and document analysis of religious texts and organizational documents.
