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

This study investigates how project-based learning (PBL) and SCAMPER approaches affect university students' ability to be creative. The aim of the study is to investigate how personality traits and these organized, student-centered teaching approaches affect creativity in higher education environments. Totally 150 juniors participated in the study. The Torrance Test of Creative Thinking (TTCT) was used to test creativity; personality questionnaires were used to gauge attributes, including flexibility in problem-solving and self-efficacy, and the Work Preference Inventory (WPI) was used to gauge intrinsic and extrinsic motivation. Through group projects supported by the Moodle platform, students could engage in cooperative learning and innovative problem-solving. The results showed that using SCAMPER and PBL techniques significantly improved the participants' fluency, creativity, and flexibility. Additionally, the study discovered a favorable correlation between higher creative performance and personality attributes including self-efficacy and a strong accomplishment orientation. Students' creativity and problem-solving skills were further strengthened through collaborative interaction on digital platforms. According to the research's practical consequences, innovative teaching strategies combined with digital resources can significantly improve student learning in higher education. These results have applications in a variety of fields where creativity and innovation are essential, such as engineering and medical education.
